 - TOEFL: IBT=45 or higher, CTB=133 or higher or PBT=450 or higher
 - TOEIC: 470 or higher
 - EIKEN/STEP: 2nd Grade A or Higher

the 2+2 Approach

What is 2+2?

Studying the first two years at a Community College such as Los Angeles City College (LACC) and then transfer to a four year University such as UCLA, USC, UC Berkeley, CSULA, Pepperdine University, Cal-Poly Pomona to name a few.

Why 2+2?

When you start your education at LACC you benefit in these ways:

- Lower TOEFL or no TOEFL requirement when you start at our Intensive English Program.
- Can use EIKEN, IELTS or other test in lieu of TOEFL.
- Pay lower tuition saving your family (over \$10,000)
- Transfer to great universities such as UCLA, USC, UC Berkeley, CSULA, Pepperdine University, Cal-Poly Pomona.
- University of California gives priority to transfers from 2 year colleges.
- Great support from the International Student office. International student advisor will help you every semester making sure you take the proper classes to transfer to the university of your dream.

An Intensive English Program

English in Los Angeles (ELA) is located on the campus of Los Angeles City College. The college was established in 1929 as the first community college in Los Angeles, and maintains a tradition of excellence in the educational community. The college offers over 2,000 academic courses and has an annual enrollment of over 15,000 students from about 80 different countries.

The coursework emphasizes the following:

- Listening and speaking skills
- Pronunciation
- Vocabulary
- Writing
- Reading
- Grammar
- Computer usage

TOEFL:

Advanced students may enroll in the TOEFL preparation course. However, graduates of the ELA may enroll at Los Angeles City College without taking the TOEFL.



INSTRUCTION AT ALL LEVELS

The comprehensive English Language Program accepts students at beginning, intermediate and advanced levels of language proficiency. Sessions begin every month and lasts for four weeks.

PLACEMENT TEST

Upon arrival, students are given a placement test to determine their language ability and their appropriate starting level.

INTENSIVE LANGUAGE STUDY

The Comprehensive English Language program at ELA provides intensive language training for College-bound students and professionals who want to develop a variety of language skills. Participants attend classes for 25 hours per week during a four week instructional period.
